“Buffalo Model”

Objectives:

Currently, most jurisdictions grant dental licensure following successful completion of a live patient exam. Testing agencies operate independent of dental schools, but conduct exams at school facilities. Concerns have been raised over the use of live patients, clinical skills tested, and standardization of exams. Faculty and licensing agencies collaborating during exams presents a possible solution. The Buffalo Model enables faculty to engage in the exam from case acceptance to final outcome assessment. This presentation will outline the collaborative effort between the University at Buffalo and the Commission on Dental Competency Assessments (CDCA), and demonstrate how it will improve licensure examinations.
