Dental Anesthesia Today

Office dental anesthesia has received significant negative publicity in recent months with associated pediatric mortality and morbidity. Articles in newspapers, TV and social media question its safety. This negative view of dentists providing anesthesia has placed state dental boards in an awkward position. How do dental boards protect the public and, at same time, recognize the legitimate ability of dentist to provide anesthesia? This three-part anesthesia symposium will highlight the current state of affairs on this topic.

In part one, *Dental Anesthesia Today*, we will discuss the changing position of the American Dental Association and CDEL on dental anesthesia. We will also explore new recommendations by the American Academy Pediatric Dentistry and discuss the training of pediatric dentists in anesthesia.

This presentation will focus on the emerging changes in health care, health science education, society, and economics that will influence dental education and practice in 2030. Trends discussed will include inter-professional education and collaborative practice models. We will also consider emerging workforce models, including dental therapy, integrating oral health systems into health systems, medically necessary dental care, and value-based approaches to oral health care. This review will include value based payment, education incentives, and public expectations. The strengthening of links with other health professions will also be presented, as will the implications of these changes on licensure and continued competency.




